Anna is more friendly than her twin sister, Abby.	Anna is four minutes younger than her twin sister, Abby.


I cut apart the boxes and mix them up before the lesson. Then I distribute one sentence to each student. Each student gets to read their sentence to the class and state whether it is a fact or an opinion statement. I also ask students to justify their answer. Classmates give a "thumbs up" if they agree, and a "thumbs down" if they disagree. (If students are unsure, I also give them the opportunity to call on a classmate for help.)
